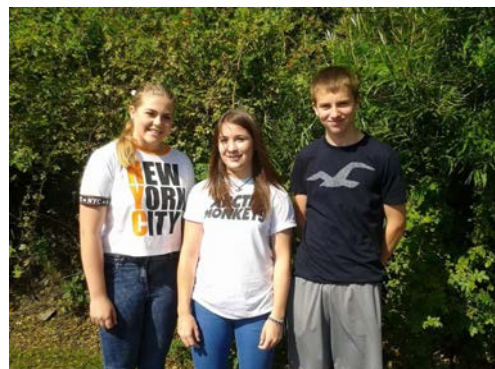
Athlete And Youth Representative Update – July

Men's League Results:

- The Pitreavie team is pushing for promotion in division 2 of the Scottish men's League.
- There was a 14 man team at the 3rd match at Grangemouth on 13th July fighting to keep promotion hopes alive. We finished 2nd on the day and now 3rd overall in the league 1 point behind VP Glasgow and 3 behind leaders Shettleston.

SIAB Schools Track and Field International Results:

- Three Pitreavie athletes competed at the SIAB International event at Cardiff representing the Scottish Schools in a match between Scotland, England, Wales and Ireland.
- Craig Moriarty from St Columba's RC High School competed in the Pole Vault gaining a bronze medal in a vault of 3.73.
- Craig's training partner Kirsten Cronie from Woodmill High School competed in the women's Pole Vault coming 5th in a vault of 2.83
- Emma Rae from Dunfermline High School competed in the Hammer coming 7th in a throw of 50.02.
- All athletes said it was a fantastic experience and very exciting to represent Scotland. Craig and Kirsten have also been selected to represent Scotland at the Sainsbury's UK School Games in September at Manchester. Emma who is still Under 15 will have to wait until next year to be eligible for selection. Well done to all athletes!



Highland Games Results:

- A fair few Pitreavie athletes have been competing at the Highland Games throughout July.
- The first Highland Games this month was Thornton Highland Gathering held in the Memorial Park on Saturday 5th July. At this event, our under 13 athlete Lewis Blair came 3rd in the 800m and won the 1600m in his first year competing in the Youths (under 16) age group.
- The next Highland Games event Pitreavie athletes have competed at was the famous Alva Games held in The Johnstone Park on Saturday 12th July. There Francis Smith came 2nd in the invitational 90m sprint.
- Pitreavie athletes also competed at the Burntisland Highland Games held at the Burntisland Links on Monday 21st July. Lewis Hunter managed to come 2nd in the Open (over 16) 90m and 1st in the 200m sprints. Corey Smith also managed to gain 3rd in the Open 800m. One of our younger athletes Eve Huxley also managed a 3rd place in the Youths 200m.
- On Saturday 26th July, Lewis Blair managed to win the Youths 1600m at the Airth Highland Games held in North Greens Park.
- The next day on Sunday 27th July, the St Andrews Highland Games were held in Station Park. Lewis Blair again won the Youths 1600m but also managed a win in



the 800m also for the double win. Sarah Ross managed a 2nd place finish in the Open 90m sprint.

- After St Andrews Highland Games a few Pitreavie athletes now have places in the Fife Leagues of the Highland Games. Sarah Ross is joint 6th in the Open up to 400m league table with 12 points. Rebecca Burns 5th stands along with Aidan Thompson and Tullibody's William Bates in the Open over 400m league table with 12 points. In the Youths over 400m League Table, Lewis Blair stands 2nd with 12 points, Dylan Thomson stands 4th with 9 points and Laura Blair stands equal 6th with 5 points.
- In the SGHA League Table, Lewis Blair stands 3rd overall in the 400m upwards Scottish League Table with 17 points and is the only Pitreavie Athlete currently holding a position in the SHGA League.

Youths Development League – Upper Results and Promotion:

- Kingdom Athletic (a composite team of Pitreavie AAC, Fife AC and Dundee Hawkhill Harriers) competed in the last match of the Upper Youths Development League (formally known as the National Junior League) at Leeds on Sunday 27th July. We managed to get 2nd place for the match points which maintained our 2nd place in the League points. As the top 2 teams get promoted, Kingdom Athletic has been promoted to Northern Premier Division 1!
